Administration Building Renovations: The Middlesex County 4-H Fair is pleased to announce that we have received State grant funding through the Massachusetts Agricultural Fairs Infrastructure Grant FY25. This funding, administered by the Massachusetts Department of Agricultural Resources, is for a complete renovation of the restrooms in the Administration Building in order to add an ADA-compliant and accessible restroom. In addition to the work being done through the grant funding, the meeting and office space is also being renovated. This includes replacing windows, walls, floor, ceiling, and power and lighting. Renovations are on schedule to be completed by July 2025. Many thanks to Rick Gray for spearheading these projects, as well as the team working with him!

4-H Fair Fun Fact: The building next to the Dog Show ring, now known as the 'Kids Café', was the original Chicken BBQ Building. Built in the 1960's, the building was moved from its original location in 2001 when the new BBQ Building was constructed.

Applicants must have been accepted by or be currently enrolled in a college or university, or, accepted by or be currently enrolled in a continuing program of higher education, including certificate and/or technical programs (such as trade schools, union apprentice programs, and EMS and other Public Safety programs). The application will be available later this week on our website and Facebook. Applications are due by <u>Tuesday</u>, July 15, 2025.
